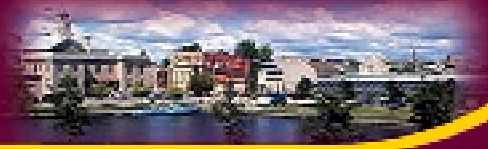




HERITAGE PERTH RECREATION

NATURAL ATTRACTIONS

- Conlon Farm Recreation Complex** 6 Conlon Drive (613) 267-3311 or 267-3702
Features lit soccer fields, ball diamonds, basketball, beach volleyball, tennis court, playground, a skateboard park and walking paths. The chalet, equipped with washrooms and a snack bar, is open from May to October.
- Foley Mountain Conservation Area** Near Westport off Cty. Rd. 10 (613) 273-3255
Features a wilderness outdoor centre with a 6 km trail. A spectacular view of the quaint village of Westport and surrounding lakes and forests can be found atop Foley Mountain.
- Murphys Point Provincial Park** 20 km south on ElmsGrove Rd. (613) 267-5060
Variety of trails past historic sites and through natural settings. The park is noted for wildlife viewing, has two restored homesteads and the remnants of a 19th-century sawmill, and offers excellent canoe and boat routes throughout the lakes within the park. The park has over 160 wooded, buffered campsites for campers.
- Perth Wildlife Reserve** South of Perth off Rideau Ferry Rd.
A conservation area featuring hundreds of species of plants and animals which can be found in the Tay Marsh, one of the most significant marshes in the area.

- Purdon Conservation Area** 35 km northwest off Lanark Cty. Rd. 8. (613) 259-2421
A unique wetland noted for its display of over 16,000 Showy Lady Slipper orchids each spring. Features a wheelchair-accessible boardwalk loop, washrooms, picnic facilities and a lookout.
- Rideau River Provincial Park** 40 minutes east of Perth near Kemptville (613) 258-2740
The park features a nice beach area and 184 level campsites in a mature pine and poplar forest; group camping also available.
- Rideau Trail** Lanark Tourism: (613) 267-4200 or 1-888-452-6275
A 300 km trail from Kingston to Ottawa; open to members of the Rideau Trail Association.
- Round Garden For The Blind** At the County Administration Offices, Sunset Blvd., Perth
A unique garden designed to be easy to navigate and to stimulate the senses of smell and touch.

- Silver Lake Provincial Park** 20 minutes west of Perth on Hwy7.
Features sandy beaches, pristine lakes, excellent fishing, and canoe and kayak rentals. There are 148 tent and trailer sites available for campers. One of the interesting trails within the park is the Silver Queen Mine Trail along which you'll find the remnants of the Silver Queen Mine, operated between 1903 and 1920. Guided tours, available at the Gatehouse, will expose you to the life of a miner at the turn-of-the-century, and the visible mica and other minerals at the site. You can also hike the trail and use the interpretive trail guide.

- Sharbot Lake Provincial Park** 30 minutes west of Perth on Hwy7.
Features sandy beaches, pristine lakes, excellent fishing, and canoe and kayak rentals. There are 185 treed campsites available for campers. A groomed, hiking trail meanders through the forest to a spectacular lookout over two lakes.

- Wheelers Maple Heritage** 25 minutes north of Perth (613) 278-2090
Features indoor and outdoor displays and a network of nature trails through a 730-acre maple forest, ... plus pancakes ... plus syrup!
